Holy Pascha The Feast of Feasts

Beloved Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Χριστός Ανέστη! Christ is Risen!

Today as we proclaim, "It is the Day of Resurrection," we glorify God, and we shout with resounding joy because it is the Day of life. Our Risen Lord is victorious over death. By His glorious Resurrection, Christ has shown the unlimited power of God as the Source and Giver of life; and because of His love for us, He has brought us from death unto life, and from earth unto Heaven. Life is restored by our Creator to all that it was meant to be! Life abundant and eternal is ours!
